Health & Safety

Please remember to use good hygiene practices at this event and use common sense to keep yourself and others safe on pool deck.

If seated upstairs in the grandstand, please ensure you dry off before leaving pool deck as the stairs become slippery when wet.

Warm-Up Procedure













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There will be allocated lanes during warm up. We ask that you please stick to these lanes as displayed on pool deck.

Accred & Access To Pool

Access to the pool is via the accredited entrance at the scoreboard end of the pool (near the athletics track) with your accreditation. For those wishing to access the grandstand, you'll need to go up the staircase just outside the accredited entrance.

An accreditation volunteer will be on hand to ensure that passes are being presented. If you do not have a valid pass – you will be required to pay the appropriate admission fee.

Accreditation must be worn, around the neck, to gain access. No accreditation no entry. Lost accreditation can be replaced at a cost of \$15.00 each – through cash or invoice to the club.

Please note, no late passes will be issued at the door as per the updated Accreditation Policy 009.

Seating

There will be no seating plan for this event, we ask that clubs work together to support each other to ensure everyone is catered for.

If seated upstairs in the grandstand, please ensure you dry off before leaving pool deck as the stairs become slippery when wet.

Please ensure you are not seated in the area marked for spectators.

Opening Ceremony

There will be an opening ceremony on Sunday afternoon at 4:50pm.

<u>Parking</u>

Parking is limited at the Sir Owen G Glenn National Aquatic Centre. Please try and limit the number of vehicles you travel into the meet and comply with parking times and fees as per the signs displayed.

Please note there won't be printed programmes being provided at the resolutions desk. There will be a copy uploaded in the Files banner of Swimify for the following session that you can print or take a photo of the programme at the resolutions desk for that session.

Session Timelines

The session timelines will be confirmed and available on Swimify in the days leading up to racing commencing.

Withdrawals

Withdrawals from events for session one will need to be submitted via email by 5pm or at the Team Managers meeting being held at 5pm on Saturday 20 September.













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Any withdrawals for session one submitted after this time will incur a withdrawal fee as per Policy 008.

Any further withdrawals for sessions 2 - 10 will not be accepted via email after 5pm on Saturday 20 September. Withdrawals need to be made via a withdrawal form which can be found at the resolutions desk located around the 25m turn on the grandstand side of pool deck.

As ALL events in all morning sessions are run as timed finals SNZ Policy 008 will apply. For timed-finals, withdrawals must be advised by the end of the session preceding the session with the timed final event.

Withdrawals from evening final races will be required to be submitted 30 minutes from posting of event results. Any competitor or team who withdraws from finals after this time shall pay without excuse to SNZ a fee of \$50 (NZD) as per SNZ Policy 008.

DQs & Protests

Disqualifications will be displayed on the big screen and you can ask to see a copy of the DQ form at the resolutions desk located halfway along the pool on the grandstand side.

Protests must be submitted to the referee, in writing, on the protest form by the team manager only within 30 minutes following the DQ result posting online. This needs to be accompanied in cash by the \$100.00 protest fee.

If conditions causing a potential protest are noted prior to the event, a protest must be lodged before the signal to start is given.

All protests shall be considered by the referee. If the referee rejects the protest, they must state the reasons for their decision. The Team Manager may appeal the rejection to the Jury of Appeal whose decision shall be final.

If the protest is rejected, the deposit will be forfeited to SNZ. If the protest is upheld the deposit will be returned.

Anyone wishing to access the pool outside these times for training will need to contact the facility directly to book lane space.

Multi-Class Racing

These championships are open to Multi-Class and Para swimmers who have a classification of some form – provisional, national or international. Please note this includes S15, S18 and S19 classifications.

Medals will be distributed based on the World Para Swimming points system (similar to the percentage of the world record calculation) and equivalent for the alternative pathway classifications using the event software of which results are final. To confirm, this means that one set of medals will be presented for each respective Multi-Class final.

<u>Relays</u>

The names of swimmers actually swimming on a relay must be submitted at least 45 minutes before the start of the session in which the event is to take place, in the













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order in which they are to swim. The names of swimmers in medley relay events must be listed for the respective strokes. Mixed relays must have 2 x female and 2 x male swimmers.

Failure to swim in the order listed will result in disqualification. Substitutions may be made only in the case of a documented medical emergency.

Marshalling

Heats:

Self-marshalling will be employed during all heat sessions. Swimmers are asked to be in the marshalling area 4 heats prior to their event. For all 50m events, swimmers need to be in the marshalling area 6 heats prior to their event.

Finals:

Swimmers (including reserves) will need to marshal 6 races prior for 50m events, and 4 races prior to their event for all other events, and remain in the marshalling area. All swimmers are required to marshal for relays. Swimsuits will be checked at marshalling for legality.

Victory Ceremonies

Medals shall be awarded for the 1st, 2nd and 3rd New Zealanders in all events for the age groups of 13 years, 14 years, 15 years, 16 years, 17 - 18 years. Medals shall be awarded for Open and Multi-Class from finals. Please note that the age group medals are determined from the swims in the morning. Visitor medals will be awarded to a maximum of two medals for any international competitor/relay team who places.

The Victory Ceremony Timetable will be included in the programmes and event schedule, and we will endeavour to run to this timetable. If for any reason there is a delay in the results being available, the medal presentation for that event will take place as soon as possible.

Dress Standard for victory ceremonies:

- Club or Regional t-shirt, jacket or sweatshirt.
- Pants or shorts MUST be worn.
- No Caps or Goggles.
- No towels to be wrapped around the waist.

There is to be strictly no photography on pool deck and the medal presentation area, all photos will be taken by the official event photographer and photos will be made













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available via Playbook link as soon as possible. Anyone taking photos in this area will be asked to leave immediately.

Rules

The championships will be delivered in accordance with Swimming NZ Policies and NZ Swimming Rules.

Club Points

As determined in previous years by the EAC, the following decision has been made in relation to club points at national competitions.

Only swimmers affiliated with New Zealand can score points for their club. Please note this means that no visitor is eligible to score club points, including those who are also members of a New Zealand club.

Please also note that if a club relay team is not filled with New Zealand affiliated swimmers, the relay team will be classed as a visitor relay and will not be eligible for club points.

Strapping

Swimmers with strapping must provide documentation from a relevant registered health practitioner or physiotherapist and be reviewed by the Technical Director (Dianne Farmer) prior to swimming. Any swimmers without such documentation may not be permitted to swim. Please email documentation to events@swimming.org.nz before 5pm on Saturday 20 September otherwise please bring with you when you when you present to the Technical Director.

Accreditations

All accredited persons must have their accreditation on them and present their pass to access the competition building via the accredited entrance. Please wear your accreditation around your neck.

If a swimmer, coach or team manager is seen to be using somebody else's accreditation, this accreditation will be removed for the remainder of the event.













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Please note that we won't be providing lanyards for 2025, so you'll need to bring your own for the championships.

Winner Interviews

We will conduct interviews with selected final winners during the championships, and may interview NZ Age and NZ Open Record breakers.

Team Managers Meeting

There will be a compulsory team manager meeting held on Saturday 20 September at 5pm in the grandstand beside the SNZ Boardroom.

Team managers will be given a brief run-down of meet activities, expectations of swimmers and clubs, and general delivery of the championships. Each club is asked to have at least one representative at the meeting. If you can't attend, please have a good understanding of this update.

Club Accreditation Collection

Accreditation passes are available to be collected from the accreditation desk from 3.00pm on Saturday. If the packs aren't collected then, they will be available to collect from the accredited entrance from Sunday morning for the rest of the championships.
