Warm-Up Procedure

We ask that you please stick to these lanes as documented on pool deck. Please note that fins and paddles will be permitted so long as health and safety is adhered to.

Access To Pool & Seating

Access to the pool is via the main pool entrance. There are no passes required to access the pool and swimmers can sit anywhere they wish around the pool.

Parking

Parking is limited at the Sir Owen G Glenn National Aquatic Centre. Please try and limit the number of vehicles you travel into the meet and comply with parking times and fees as per the signs displayed.

We will have printed programmes for swimmers who would like to obtain one, available for collection at the resolutions desk just inside the main pool entrance.

Withdrawals

If a swimmer would like to withdraw from an event, please email <u>entries@swimming.org.nz</u> by Friday 23 May 9.00am.

DQs & Protests

Disqualifications will be announced and a copy of the DQ form will be available at the resolutions desk located halfway along the pool on the non-grandstand side.

Protests must be submitted to the referee, in writing, on the protest form by the team manager only within 30 minutes following the DQ result posting online. This needs to be accompanied in cash by the \$100.00 protest fee.

If conditions causing a potential protest are noted prior to the event a protest must be lodged before the signal to start is given.

All protests shall be considered by the referee. If the referee rejects the protest, they must state the reasons for their decision. The Team Manager may appeal the rejection to the Jury of Appeal whose decision shall be final.

If the protest is rejected, the deposit will be forfeited to SNZ. If the protest is upheld the deposit will be returned.







Competition Information

Opening Hours

Competition Days (Friday 23 – Sunday 25 May) Sessions - 12:00pm (warm-up) and 12.50pm (racing)

Age Groups

This event will be swum as timed finals, with results provided across age groups. Results will be awarded for each of the following age groups:

18 – 24 years 25 – 29 years 30 - 34 years 35 – 39 years 40 - 44 years 45 - 49 years 50 - 54 years 55 – 59 years 60 - 64 years 65 - 69 years 70 – 74 years 75 – 79 years 80 - 84 years 85 – 89 years 90 - 94 years 95 – 99 years 100+ years

18 – 30 years (Multi-Class) 31 – 45 years (Multi-Class) 46 – 60 years (Multi-Class) 61+ years (Multi-Class)

800m and 1500m Freestyle Swimmers

Swimmers who have entered both the 800m and 1500m Freestyle events will swim the 1500m only. Their split time will be recorded for the 800m event. Lap counters will be available for each swimmer.

<u>Relays</u>

There will be the following relays in this year's schedule:

- 4 x 50m Medley Relay (male & female)
- 4 x 50m Medley Relay (mixed)
- 4 x 50m Freestyle Relay (male & female)
- 4 x 50m Freestyle Relay (mixed)

Relay age groups will be calculated by the combined age of the team (eg: team is aged 41, 45, 31, 65 means the combined age is 182).







Results will be awarded for each of the following relay age group categories:

Teams must confirm entries with names and respective ages in swimming order to be submitted no later than 45mins before the session commences. Please note this takes time to complete the relay entry process, so the earlier the better. Because of this, no late entries will be accepted.

Composite and unofficial relay teams are encouraged to increase participation opportunities.

Marshalling

Self-marshalling will be employed during all sessions. Swimmers are asked to be in the marshalling area prior to their event. We encourage swimmers to be in the marshalling area:

- 6 timed finals prior for 50m events.
- 4 timed finals prior for all other events.

Victory Ceremonies

Medals shall be awarded for the 1st, 2nd and 3rd New Zealanders for the champion of each age group at the end of the championships. These will be decided from collating points across all races swum by each individual. Visitor medals will be awarded to any international competitor who places.

The Victory Ceremony will take place at the conclusion of racing on Sunday 25 May. Join us in the Finish Line Room of the AUT Millennium building for a selection of shared platters and a cash bar available from 3pm.

Please note that no medals will be posted out.

Dress Standard for victory ceremonies:

- T-shirt, jacket or sweatshirt if you belong to a club please wear your club colours
- Shorts/trousers/skirt must be worn
- Shoes must be worn
- No Caps or Goggles

The championships will be delivered in accordance with Swimming NZ Policies and NZ Swimming Rules.

This is a World Aquatics sanctioned Masters meet, where all records and rankings can be set.

Strapping

Swimmers with strapping must provide documentation from a relevant registered health practitioner or physiotherapist and be reviewed by the Technical Director prior to swimming. Any swimmers without such documentation may not be permitted to swim.

Pre-Competition Information Meeting

There will be a pre-competition meeting held on Friday 23 May at 12pm next to the scoreboard. Another will be held on Saturday 24 May at 12pm in the same location.

Those who attend will be given a brief run-down of meet activities, expectations of swimmers and clubs and general delivery of the event.

If you are unable to attend, please familiarise yourself with this document and the preevent email well.

Photography & Videography

Photos and videos will be taken throughout the competition. All athletes and spectators have agreed to allow photographs, videos, and audio recordings to be taken by accredited SNZ contractors to be used for any legitimate purpose by SNZ. If you have any concerns please contact <u>events@swimming.org.nz</u>.

Spectators agree upon entry that photographic, video or audio recording equipment is prohibited for any purpose which may include, without limitation, video and/or audio recorders, camera tripods, monopods, or lenses with a total focal strength of greater than 300mm and commercial digital video equipment. The SNZ Event staff will, at their sole discretion, determine whether or not an item is intended for personal or commercial use.
